**Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat** was announced by Hon'ble Prime Minister on 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2015 on the occasion of the 140<sup>th</sup> birth Anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. The **Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat** programme aims to actively enhance interaction between people of diverse cultures living in different States and UTs in India, with the objective of promoting greater mutual understanding amongst them. The underlying philosophy was to make the youth aware of our rich and diverse culture and be proud of it. Under this scheme, colleges/institutions are paired up to encourage the students from another college and volunteer them to make aware of the local culture.

The State of Sikkim and Delhi are the paired state to implement the program under **Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat**. Accordingly, AICTE has paired National Institute of Technology Sikkim and Delhi School of Business, Delhi for the cultural exchange program.

### **About NIT Sikkim**

NIT Sikkim is a premier Institute offering undergraduate, post graduate and doctoral programs in the engineering background. It offers B.Tech. programs in 5 streams – Computer Science engineering, Civil engineering, Mechanical engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering and Biotechnology Engineering. They offer M.Tech. programs in Computer Science and PhD in all streams. The campus is nestled in the valleys surrounded by Kanchenjunga peak. It is one of the 31 national Institutes of Technology in India and has been declared as an Institute of National Importance by the Government of India. The entrance to the temporary campus in Ravangla is through an ornate gate. Cherry blossom trees in and around the campus delight the visitors.

The infrastructure includes MP Hall (Auditorium), a well stocked library, computer labs, a power generation plant, separate hostels for girls and boys, housing accommodations for Ph.D. students and guests, mess, canteen and playgrounds for different sports.

### **About Delhi School of Business**

Delhi School of Business is located in Pitampura, New Delhi and offers a 2 year full-time PGDM program approved by AICTE, accredited by NBA and granted equivalent to MBA by Associations of Indian Universities (AIU). DSB was started in 2012 under the aegis of Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies, a renowned name under IP University. They offer dual specialisation in Marketing, Finance, Human Resources, Data Analytics, International Business and FinTech. The campus is spread across five acres and is equipped with state-of-the-art classrooms; library with a vast collection of books, national and international journals and subscription to online data bases; Finance and Analytics labs, auditorium to seat 300 students; Vivekananda hall to seat 600 students and digitally equipped canteen.

NIT Sikkim offered to host students of Delhi School of Business under the cultural exchange program under **Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat**. Accordingly, 22 Management students and 2

faculty members from Delhi School of Business visited NIT from 14<sup>th</sup> November to 20<sup>th</sup> November 2022.

## Experiences and Learning:

### Day 0 (Day of travel 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2022)

The participants from Delhi School of Business arrived at NIT Sikkim campus at 10:30 pm and received with heartfelt welcome by the organizing team.



### Day 1: (15<sup>th</sup> Nov, 2022)

The formal introductory session was organized where faculties from DSB were facilitated with a *Khada*. Dr. Pratyay Kuila, Faculty Incharge EBSB of NIT Sikkim has welcomed the participants and briefed about the program. He also highlighted the academia and other performance of NIT Sikkim.

The gathering was addressed by the Director, Professor Mahesh Chandra Govil who very beautifully said “every citizen of this country must proudly mention our Nationality, i.e. Firstly, I am Indian”. Meaning that, one must not say that he/she is from Delhi or Sikkim or Punjab. Instead of this, they must proudly mention that they are Indians. He also very nicely explained how India used to be a “*Soney ki Chidhiya*” and how everyone came to loot us. We should still consider ourselves as the same *Soney ki Chidhiya*, as we are still rich with our culture and its diversity.



This was followed by a presentation on Delhi School of Business by Prof. (Dr.) Neerja Arora.



The introductory session was concluded with delicious traditional Sikkimese snacks - Sel Roti, Momos and Khapje along with flavored hot tea.

### **Visit to Buddha Park:**

In the second half, the team has visited Buddha Park in Ravangla. It really calmed the mind and taken aback by the amazing and intricate designs in the gallery of the park depicting the life of Gautam Buddha. Even the 12 deeds demonstrating the life of Gautam Buddha towards the enlightenment really was a great lesson for all. The wishing well outside the Buddha Sanctum was also a sight in itself.



To brief here, the sculpture of Buddha in the Sanctum Sanctorum was also incredibly beautiful. The deeds which started with the 5 important decisions taken by Buddha like the place, the time, the mother, the caste and, the process of the birth. Then the deeds also explained the meaning of taking place from the right side of his mother Mayadevi signifying that everything is possible in the mortal world as well. The name of his meaning “Siddhartha” meaning “The one who makes everything possible” also states that nothing is impossible for mortals.



After enjoying the Royal princely life and getting married to the beautiful princess Yashodra and had a son named Rahul he renounced that at the mere age of 29. The renunciation was, when he saw four different types of events in front of the 4 gates opening from his palace. There he saw sickness, old age, death and a beggar monk. Then for 6 years he renounced all the worldly affairs and started meditating. After many years of solitude, he attained enlightenment. Thus started the Buddhist faith and he started preaching to his disciples who spread the learning far and wide.



## Trek to Mt. Narsing Village Resort

Then, in the evening there was a trek organized for DSB students. The students were energetic during the 6 Kms long trek and enjoyed the scenic beauty of Sikkim and the view from the hilltop after the trek. The resort on the top of the hill had a culmination of all the traditional Sikkimese products and Bhutia Masks. The experience was complete along with cups of herbal organic tea and aromatic coffee.



## Day 2: (16<sup>th</sup> Nov, 2022)

The programme was organized by the Students of NIT Sikkim in collaboration with the school students from nearby locality. The daylong event started with a presentation about the geographical and cultural diversity of Sikkim. The participants were made aware of the composition of Sikkim, the languages spoken, the religions, the local cultures, dress of different Sikkimese ethnic community, traditions and the foods. Students of NIT Sikkim sang the state song which praised and showed the love for Kanchenjunga and the river Teesta flowing through the state. After the presentation, a stupendous cultural performance including skits, songs and dances by students of NIT Sikkim, schools and the Kapinjal Children Home. The team was really mesmerized by such amazing performances by young children. Even the Maruni dance performance and specially the skit of India being the *Sone ki Chidhiya* left the gathering into teary eyed.

### Performances

The students of NIT Sikkim regaled with their musical performances in their regional languages. The students were dressed in traditional clothes – Nepalese and Bhutia attire. Followed by the children of Kapinjal Home presented many cultural performances, skit representing the religious diversity of India and the sacrifices made by our never forgotten freedom fighters of India.

Students of NIT Sikkim performed a Maruni dance by the girls, which is the oldest and most famous dance form of Nepalese community.

The students of Delhi School of Business also performed Bhangra and other hindi dance to reflect the culture of Delhi.

After that, team proceeds for sumptuous and delicious local Sikkimese lunch at the Aansham Kutir Homestay. The idea was to expose the participants in the sikkimese hospitality of local cuisine and to experience the local taste. The food comprised of Dal, Bhat, Roti, a preparation of local beans and potato, gundruk, yogurt, spinach preparations and many other dishes.

In the evening, a short interaction program was organized between the students of DSB and NIT Sikkim. The students and Faculty of Delhi School of Business have given feedback and the expectation on the cultural exchange program. The event was followed by the felicitation of participants with Sikkimese token of remembrance with high-tea and snacks.



#### Day 4: (18<sup>th</sup> Nov, 2022)

Char Dham is a huge pilgrimage & cultural complex developed by the Sikkim Government to promote Religious, Eco and Village tourism in the state. The team was taken to the premises of Char Dham at Namchi, South Sikkim. There is a huge statue of Shiva and a Shiva temple where the students and Faculty members made Puja offerings.



There were 12 Shivlings and replicas of 4 Dhams of India- Badrinath temple (North), Dwarka Dham (West), Jagannath Dham (East) and Rameshwaram Dham (South). The members of the cultural exchange programs paid obeisance at these temples and experienced spiritual peace.



**Day 5: (19<sup>th</sup> Nov, 2022)**

The students and Faculty of Delhi School of Business started their return journey. Mesmerized by the cherry blossom trees dotted along the roads. En route, driving through Sikkim have series of falls, lake and monastery. The waving flags (lungta) are supposed to spread positive vibes through the air and it has the same effect as chanting mantras. The different colours of the flags represent Sky, Wind, Water, Earth and Fire. In most of the local shops and taxis seen flags with the mantra OM MANI PAE MEY HUN which is considered an auspicious chant in Buddhism.



The five day long program under EBSB remain informative, educative and entertaining to the participants and host. The guest team take a leave from NIT campus saying “We found the people of Sikkim are very polite, courteous, warm and hospitable”
