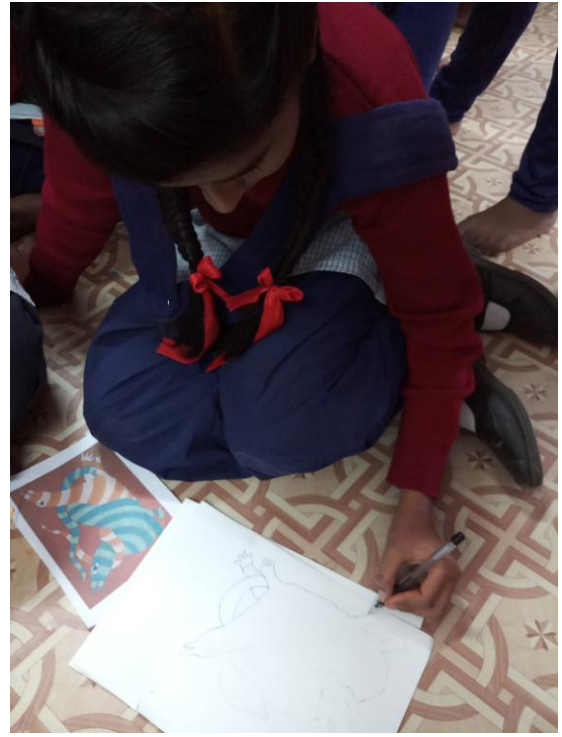
## TRIBAL PENTETING COMPETITION
