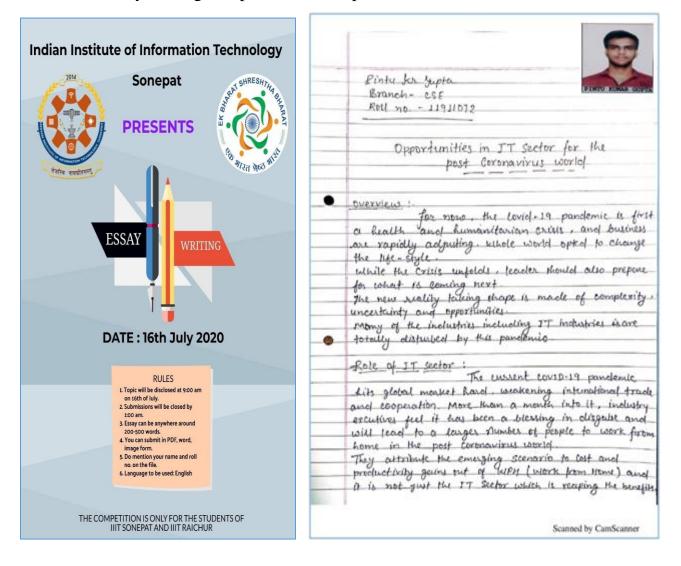




Essay writing competition

The coronavirus, starting in the city of Wuhan, China, has made a devastating impact in the modern world and economy. India, especially, has been one of the worst hit countries and currently has the third highest number of patients, as of now. However as the old proverb says, "Everything happens for a reason", the coronavirus has actually brought about the much needed change in the IT industry so rapidly that no one would have imagined it was possible. According to Satya Nadella, the CEO of Microsoft, "We saw 2 years of digital transformation in 2 months", which is a very big achievement indeed. The coronavirus, though being a very tragic event overall, has opened a wide set of opportunities for the generation of the future. Almost all the industries have seen very rapid technological development.

Education in particular is one of the most affected industries. Now despite many students in India lacking basic gadgets like smartphones and stable internet facilities, almost all institutions have moved to online classes. Now we can all talk about the ethics of that, but we should see this as an opportunity to develop cheaper smartphones. Almost all major brands are moving to make their phones more feature packed, while also increasing prices subsequently. What we can instead focus on is the creation of cheap, reliable phones without all the bells and whistles of the more expensive ones, which can be made accessible to all parts of India. Approximately 500 Million (37%) of people use smartphones. The remaining 63% are unable to due to the high cost of even the cheapest usable smartphone(Rs. 7000). What the newer generation or existing companies can focus on is creating smartphones under Rs. 3000 which would encourage a lot of new users to purchase their first smartphone.

Also the work from home policy has brought about an incremental change in the usage of Cloud Computing. Almost all major Cloud Computing, like AWS, Google Cloud, Azure are based out of the US. Now India can also seize this opportunity by developing native cloud service providers which will be able to compete with the international players. This will be beneficial for India, both from a technological and economic standpoint.

Coronavirus has also ignited the field of Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence. Many universities and companies are starting to apply predictive ML models on the coronavirus crisis to calculate the current trends and make future predictions. I believe that these ML models can also be applied on a lot of other problems including but not limited to mask detection, body temperature detectors to eliminate human risks involved in testing and the list is endless. A recent Al based Coronavirus detector has been created by some biotech students in Mumbai which can detect whether a person is infected or not just by listening to his voice samples, which is a very fruitful use of the technology, and the possibilities of Al are endless.

Blockchain technology has also been restarted by the emergence of the virus. Many countries are starting to adopt some form of blockchain to perform the important task of contact tracing. These apps, while being necessary for the containment of the virus, also keep in mind the privacy of the user by ensuring that the data is not used for malicious purposes by making the whole process of data collection completely decentralised, thus making sure that no central authority has access to all of the data, and the data is protected in case of a security breach.

All in all, even though the tragic event has brought a huge loss for humanity, the old proverb "Necessity is the mother of invention" still holds true and we should look at this event as a blessing in disguise and as a platform for further growth in technology.

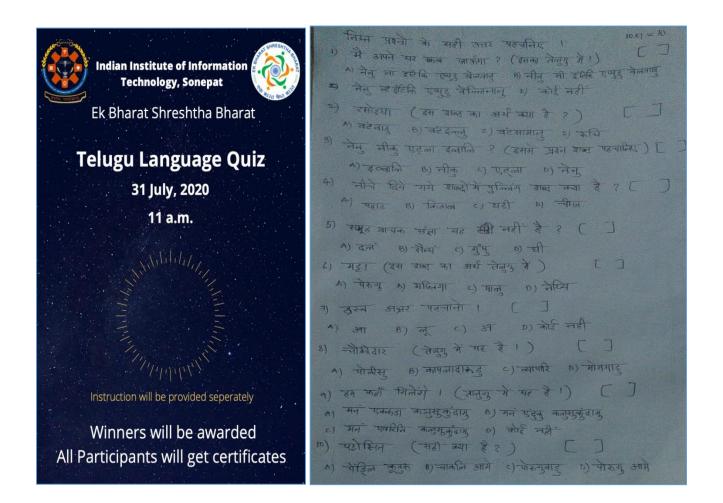


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<u>Telugu Language Quiz</u>
