EBSB Translation Day Celebrations –

St. Xavier's College for Women, located in Aluva, Ernakulam, Kerala, St. Bede's College in Shimla, Himachal Pradesh jointly conducted 'Vivarthan', an interactive exchange session on 30th September 2020, on account of it being celebrated as International Translation Day. Owing to the currently plaguing pandemic situation worldwide, the program was conducted online, via the Google Meet platform, from 3 to 4 in the afternoon.

The coordinating committee for the session included staff club coordinators Mrs. Sruthy Francis and Mrs. Sonia John Markose, both being faculty of the Department of English at St. Xavier's College for Women. From St. Bede's College, the program was overseen by Mr. Manu Mahajan, the EBSB club coordinator of the college.
