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INTRODUCTION

About AKAM-EBSB: Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) is an initiative of the Government of India to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of independence and the glorious history of it's people, culture and achievements. It is fuelled by the spirit of Aatmanirbhar Bharat. 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. Amrit Mahotsav meaning <u>Nectar</u> of grand celebration which signifies the 75 years of India's independence from <u>British Raj</u> The overall celebrations began on 12-03-2021 and will continue up to 15-08--2023.

Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) programme is a ongoing Iconic event under AKAM. EBSB aims to enhance interaction & promote mutual understanding between people of different states/UTs through the concept of state/UT pairing. As part of it, Ministry of Education in association with AICTE and several Ministries paired states. Andhra Pradesh is paired with Punjab. Students visit to paired states is a sub-theme in EBSB. Students of one state shall visit their paired state and learn/ understand the culture, cuising, attire and etc of the paired state along with visiting historical and freedom fight related places.

Part of this, Aditya Institute of Technology and Managemetn (A) was selected as Sender Institution and LPU was selected as a Receiver Institution by AICTE. Aditya Institute of Technology and Management in association with Samagra Shiksha (School Education), Andhra Pradesh, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sanghatan and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samithi took students to LPU, Jalandhar, Punjab. The 05 days tour in Punjab held from 04-08-2022 to 08-08-2022.



Based on industry and student feedback, the college faculties interact with university in updating the curriculum time to time. The college offers some value added courses to its students apart from the curriculum prescribed by university.

The success of the college is due to its well qualified faculty 80 faculty are awarded Ph.Ds and large number are pursuing Ph.D. The progress of each course in every semester is closely monitored by a class committee which includes representatives from students. 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Pre-Arrangements (Before reaching Punjab)

Management and Principal of AITAM called for a meeting of HoDs and Deans. In this meeting, Nodal Officer, AITAM briefed the details of the visit. Institute, after receiving information from AICTE to act as a Sender Institute, issued a circular inviting interested students. Consent forms were taken from interested candidates. SC/ST/ Woman/ NCC candidates were given due weightage. Students from Govt. Degree College, Tekkali, Mother Teresa Jr. College were also selected. School Education, A.P, KVs & NVs sent their lists to Nodal Officer, AITAM. After discussing with all the departments, Nodal Officer booked train tickets for all the participants.

AITAM conducted special vaccination drive to its participants. Institute also wrote letters to Sr. DCMs with a request to allot all bearths in a single bogie. Meantime, Nodal Officer was in touch with Mo Youth Affairs, AICTE officials, paired institute Nodal Officer and other stake holders. As planned, school education department handed over all their children to Nodal Officer in Visakhapatnsm. Sender institute took the care of the all the participants from Visakhapatnam. But, AITAM booked tickets for the benefit of School Education participants from Vijayawada – Visakhapatnam – Vijayawada. AITAM monitored all the participants and ensured their safety from stepping out from their home to stepping into their home.

Orientation Program to Participants

A orientation session was organized to all the participating students of AITAM in AITAM. Prof. V. V. Nageswara Rao, Director, AITAM said, 'Earlier we used to send students to Industrial Tours and visits. Due to unavoidable circumastances, we stopped such practise. This is a good opportunity for you to explore the socio-cultural diversity of India, behavior of various people. We will be always with you. Behave respectfully towards others, observe things, observe the diversity of the country, try to find out solutions to problem of people of India'. Dr. A. S. Srinivasa Rao, Principal, in his message said, 'you



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are fortunate that GoI has planned such a wonderful activity. Learn the paired state's culture, make good friends and grow in your career'.

Mr. S. Bhaskara Babu, Nodal Officer, EBSB, AITAM explained about AKAM, EBSB and purpose this visit. He aslo mentioned about the Dos and Don't's during this visit. He said, 'I am not your teacher during this visit. I am like your father in this vist. We are going to Punjab to know/ learn/ observe their culture. So, please follow the instructions and act accordingly'. Later dignitories clarified doubts raised by the studets. A whatsapp group was created by the Nodal Officer through which managements, Directors, Principals, Govt. officilas, Escort teachers, students and teachers were brought under one umbrella. Dignitories gave suggestions, shared information and clarified the doubts of various stakeholders through this group time to time.

Then, opening ceremony took place in Administrative block. AICTE officials, LPU officials and Andhra Pradesh representatives shared their experiences and wished the gathering all the very best.

In the post lunch session, visitors went to Shaheed-E-Azam, Bhagat Singh's Museum and house in Bhagat Singh Nagar. During this journey, students saw the mustard and wheat fields, Punjabi housing structure. They are like 'forts'. Many two to three storied buildings surrounded by compound wall of 8 – 10 feet height were visible. Many houses were in between the fields. Paintings and slogans of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Raj Guru and Sukh Dev were predominantly visible on the walls of the houses. We first reached to Museum, since repair work was going on, we were not allowed inside the museum. There was a big statue in front of the Museum, a ten year old boy in military dress along with his father reached close to the statue and celebrated his birthday. It was an amazing moment in our lives. Then, we went to Shaheed Bhagat Singh's ancestral house. It is a preserved monument. Here, we viewed the



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utensils, cots, well and belongings. It is an amazing experience for all of us. We felt, amazing breeze with freedom in this place. CRPF personnel joined with us.

Returning to LPU, we reached the Block-13 where we experienced the rich Bhangra Dance. Instructor, showed how the dance is performed. He also taught few Bhangra steps to students. We reached our accommodation with lots of joys and memories, had our food and took rest. Everyday before and at the end of each session, we did the head count to ensure 'all the students are present and safe'.

<u>*Our third day*</u> i.e. 06-08-2022 began with variety of foods in breakfast. The schedule for the day was so hectic. We reached Department of Hotel Management. Head of the department, in department conference hall, gave a beautiful presentation on 'Punjabi cuisine'. Later students were taken to kitchens/ cooking laboratories. Here, students prepared 'Salad', 'Dal Makhani', 'Panner Butter Masala', 'Papad the chat', 'Lassi', 'Vegetarian Pulav', different types of rotis-tandoor, naan, 'Punjabi Choormai', 'Baingan Bharta' in the presence of experts. The same delicious foods were served to students.





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In the post lunch session, we visited Fashion Technology block. Head of the Department presented the varieties of Punjabi dresses that are worn during various occasions by Punjabis - Tamba and Kurtha, Suthan, Salwar Kameez, Ghagra. Students were attracted to 'Phulkari art sarees and dupattas'. This handicraft seems beautiful, involved lot of thread work, needs lot of attention. But, all the color threads and work is visible in the front side of the garment only. Students showed interest on the 'Jutis'.



Once again, we went to Lakshmi Mittal Auditorium where Cultural Exchange Program was planned. Here, LPU provided us an opportunity to showcase the culture of Andhra Pradesh and Punjab. Students of various parts of the country sitting in the Auditorium experienced the rich classical performances from paired states. Andhra Pradesh students performed 'Kuchipudi – Jathiswaralu' classical dance performances. Tyagaraja keerthana was sung by Andhra Pradesh participants. School student performed 'Yogasanas'. Punjabi students performed 'Bhangra Dance' and 'Punjabi folk dance'.

Shri. Rajesh Bali, Officer, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Jalandhar also enjoyed the performances. In his message, Shri. Rajesh Bali said, 'Punjab and Andhra Pradesh, both states have rich culture and heritage. Knowing the culture of other state will build confidence in us. It is important to respect other cultures in a country like India, where the cultural diversity is more'.





On the occasion of 'Har Ghar Tiranga', participants and dignitories held 'Flags' in their hands. Some flags were also distributed to students.

Male students of Andhra Pradesh along with Nodal Officer, attended the cultural program in traditional shirt and lungi. They showcased traditional Tulugu attire on the stage to Punjabi students.

Later we were taken to PVR Cinema, Jalandar to watch the Punjabi movie, "Challa Mudke Nahi Aaya". The film showcased the 1900s Punjabi housing, people, society and etc. Though we could not understand the dialogues, we enjoyed the story of the film. We understood Punjabi villages in 1900s, how Punjabis reached Canda in those days and their hardwork was in establishing own businesses in Canada.

Forth day i.e. 07-08-2022 after head count bus started from LPU to Amritsar. It was much awaited journey for all of us as were goin to see the Jalianwala Bagh, Golden Temple and Attari Boarder. We observed very big 'Havelies'/ Marriage/ Function Halls between Pagwara - Jalandhar. Their decoration,



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richness and spread clearly indicated the importance given to marriage ceremony by Punjabis. We also saw, War memorials, Cantonments from bus.

We reached Jalianwala Bagh first. A place close to Golden Temple, said to be the culture center of Punjab before the massacre. We felt the real meaning of 'sacrifice', 'patriotism'. Cruelty of Dyer is still visible in the form of 'Gun wounds' on the walls. Students visited 'nook-and-corner', saluted the 'amar jyothi' and 'memorial sculpture'. Streets were so busy with commuters and traders. Phulkari work was predominantly visible on Dupattas and Sarees. 'Juti' of different designs, 'Men Punjabi Kadas', rings, 'Lassi' were predominantly seen in the market.





Later, we reached Golden Temple. We cleaned our feet and poured water drops on our head. Since, it was a Sunday, lakhs of people came to see the holy shrine. Our heart was filled with holiness after entering the 'Sri Har Mandir Sahib' complex. A cloth was given to tie on our head. Sikh Central

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Museum, Amrit Sarovar was inside the vast temple complex. Locals told us that because of 'Amrit Sarovar' the city got the name 'Amritsar'. Sri Har Mandir Sahib means, 'abode of almighty god' was built by 4th Guru, Sri. Ram Das ji in 1600 A.D. We entered the 'Guru Ka Langar' where we took our 'prasad/ meal'. Here we observed that, 'people should keep both their palms together and towards the sky', then only the temple employees will serve the 'Roti Prasad'. People can eat any number of rotis. Dal and sweet were also served to us. All the items were delicious. Punjabi people and visitors were moving with full discipline in a 'queue' in the temple. The main shrine is in between the sarovar. We went to Shrine and took our Prasad (Sweet made of Suji and Jaggary) in this Gurudwara'. We saluted the Gurus. We saluted the tree under which Guru Ram Das sat and monitored the construction.

Many of us entered and worshipped in a Gurudwara for the first time. Prasad distribution system of Gurudwaras is different from other temples. Some students gave Rs. 200/- / Rs. 300/-/ Rs. 500/- in the token counters thinking that 'more paid will get more prashad'. For each Rs. 100/- they gave a separate 'prashad' plate. Later we were asked to deposit the prashad in another counter. We once again thought that 'more paid will get more prashad'. Here, the counter collected all the 2/3/5 big plates with prashad But, the counter cleark distributed equal quantity to all of us. Later we came to know that, "in Sikh Gurudwaras, prashad is not sold. Instead, people can offer any amount of money to their satisfaction to god. Prashad will be distributed to all equally. The underlying concept we understood was 'prashad should reach to all particularly the poor equally, i.e. in front of god, all are equal'.

After coming out, our hearts were filled with joy and respect to the almighty. The superb white marble construction, 3 - 4 floored stunned us. Fishes in the Sarovar were so large and heavy. Authorities must be praised for maintaining the Gurudwara in such a clean and neat condition. Head cloth was removed.



We visited nearby market and purchased, Kadas, Sarees, Salwar Kameez and Jutis. We drank the delicious Amrusar Lassi. Purchasing articles is a meaningful way of understanding other cultures.

Then we started towards Attari border. We could saw the fencing between India and Pakistan. Green fields on both sides robed our hearts. Showers welcomed us in Attari border. After security check we sat in seats reserved for us. Thanks to LPU, CRPF and BSF authorities for making these arrangements. Girls were invited to dance to patriotic songs by BSF. Girl students enjoyed dancing. We purchased Flags and caps in respect of BSF. Parade started at around 06.00 PM.

It was a movement of no words. According to the instructions of BSF jawans, we gave slogans. We observed Indians outnumbering Pakistanis i.e huge croud was gathered in Indian side pavillion than Pakistan side pavillion. Our heart struck for a movement, while bothe the both BSF jawans came close to each other after opening the GATEs on either side with slogans and aggressive postures. 'Slogans like Bharat Mata Ki Jai' were pronounced in loud voice. After the completion of the ceremoney we returned towards our bus with a 'heavy heart'. We unserstood the sacrificises of Jawans working in the borders.

We purchased Mugs with 'boarder march' photos, Flags, 'T-Shirts', key chains to gift our peers of Andhra Pradesh.



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
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It was felt by all that, 'the fields and trees do not know that they are separated. They all are enjoying the same breeze'. Some one in the crowd was telling to his relatives that 'In 1947, India was not divided. Only Punjab was divided'. We also observed that 'many of the soldiers marching on both sides are Sikhs only'. The tall stood pavillion on Indian side has Mahatma Gandhi photo at the top. The brutality of British in separating a vast historical country was eye-witnessed by us.

In return, we stopped at 'Haveli' a Punjabi dhaba-restaurant. Un like other restaurants, It depicts the Punjabi village life style. There are lots of scluptures arranged in huts which gave us an idea of life in Punjabi. Particularly 'women preparing rotis' 'women in village' 'eating together' attracted our attention. After taking refreshments we continued our journey to LPU.

Throught the 120 KM long journey to LPU we discusse about the sacrifices made by our freedom fighters, sung songs and danced Bhangra steps for Punjabi Songs.





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<u>On the fifth day</u> i.e. on 08/08/2022, we woke-up a bit late and completed our breakfast. We reached bus boarding point by 09.15 AM. We were taken to Department of Agriculture first. Here we saw the 'soil less culturing of seeds and small plants and watering them with movable large size sprinklers'. Head of the department of Agriculture received us and explained about the ongoing work of the department. We visited Agriculture fields, Sugarcane fields, Animal breeding center and etc.



Later we visited Bio-technology, Mechanical Engineering and Civil Engineering Departments. Students interacted with the faculty, visited laboratories and asked about the new mechinary available in the laboratories. AITAM students from ME and CE branches alogn with others interacted with the ME and CE faculty of LPU and understood the safe laboratory measures, curriculam and laboratory experiments followed in LPU.



In the post lunch session, 'Scrap book' event was organized. Students were given scrap books, sketch pens, Photos and other stationary. Students were asked to recollect their memories with the photos.

Laster Mr. S. Bhaskara Babu, Nodal Officer, EBSB, Aditya Institute of Technology shared his comments. He thanked officials of MoE, AICTE, different ministries, Prof. V. V. Nageswara Rao, Director, AITAM, Dr. A. S. Srinivasa Rao, Principal, colleagues in AITAM, Sri. Neeraj Mahajan, Observer AICTE, officials of LPU for giving this chance. He said, 'EBSB is a fentastic program. Through this, states are paired and students got an opportunity to visit paired state culture, cuission, attire and etc. Not only of the paired state culture, during travel, we crossed 9 - 10 states, spoken with various people, listened different languages and come across different cultures. This will help you to understand the concept of 'Unity in diversity' of India. This will make you stronger, enhance patriortism and hope it leads to Shreshtha Bharat'. He also said, 'this knowledge should not be stopped with you. Share your experiences to your friends'.



All the visitors gave a detailed not of words they have learnt for eg. 'Munda (Boy), Kudi (Girl), Kidda Haal (What is the situation), Ee Munda bahut vadiya (He is a good boy) and etc. They also shared that 'Makki di roti and Sarson Ka Saag, Butter Roti, Dal Makhani, Papad the Chat' are their favourate dishes. Nodal officers explained that 'Punjabi dishes contain less salt, chilli and spices, it seems to us, when compared to Andhra Pradesh dishes'

Dr. Sorabh Lakhanpal, Dean, SWD, LPU addressed the gathering and said, 'LPU is a fabulous place to visit and study. Here you can interact with people of all states of India and people of foreign countries also. LPUs culture enhances your learning capatities as you will have an opportunity to work with people of far off cultures'.

He explained as, 'Covid-19 has given us lot of challenges and opportunities. Online education/ learning increased. But, one cann't learn Swimming onele. You are fortunate that out of lakhs of students you got a chance to visit a different culture. Share your knowledge to your peers and you are the next generation, use this knowledge to buile a Shreshtha Bharat'. He thanked all the officials of various ministries, LPU, AITAM, State Governments'

Last but not the least, Dr. Nithin Bharadwaj, Associate Dean, SWD, LPU in his closing remarks said, 'we tried our level best to make this tour a grand success. I thank authorities, Nodal Officers, parents and specially children for their support and cooperation'. Dignitories of Andhra Pradesh were felicitated and students were given certificates by LPU. Program was closed after giving the vote of thanks.
