
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
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
ACTIVITY REPORT ON CULTURAL HERITAGE OF MAHARASHTRA

Team members of EBSB club have been explained various cultural heritage of Maharashtra, some of them are: Ajanta Caves (group of 31 rock cut cave monuments that represent the religious art






















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of Buddhism), Ellora Caves (it is an accurate reflection of India's ancient civilization. In addition to Buddhism, they also depict Hinduism and Jainism), Elephanta Caves (It consists of 2 groups of caves; One group consists of 5 Hindu caves while the other, 2 Buddhist caves), Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (It is a world Heritage Site as well! Formerly known as Victoria Terminus, this station terminates the central and harbor railway line), Shri Sai Baba Temple (it is a religious place in Shirdi), Aga Khan Palace(It is one of the most important landmarks in Indian history and has been instrumental in many defining moments of India's independence), Bibi Ka Maqbara(It is a beautiful mausoleum of Rabia- Ul - Daurani alias Dilras Banu Begum, the wife of Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb & was constructed by Aurangzeb in the year 1661 in the memory of his wife), Lohagad Fort(It is a UNESCO world heritage site & was built in the 18th century and is an ideal destination for trekking and nature lovers), Shaniwar Wada(This grand mansion was built by the Peshwa Bajirao - I & himself as the residence of the Peshwas), Daulatabad Fort (It is an ancient fortification that rises formidably from the midst of verdant greenery), The Gateway of India(It is one of the defining monuments of the city of Mumbai and was built in the year 1924) and Raigad Fort (The fort is of great pride for the Marathas and is a reminder of the bravery and audacity. The Raigad fort is not just a tourist spot; it is a sacred place of pilgrimage which holds the imprints of the grand vision of Hindavi Swarajya as cherished by Chhatrapati Shivaji).

Prof. Rudra of AIT has explained the importance of the webinar to explore the culture heritage knowledge among students of both the States. Dr. S. N. 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
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
