
To celebrate the event EBSB club CMRIT Bangalore has conducted the third activity "Contribution of Kannada to Literature".

The Kannada language is written using the Kannada script, which evolved from the 5th-century Kadamba script. The language had flourished in the 6th-century Ganga dynasty and during the 9th-century Rashtrakuta Dynasty.

The earliest examples of a full-length Kannada language stone inscription (shilaashaasana) containing Brahmi characters with characteristics attributed to those of proto-Kannada in Hale Kannada (lit Old Kannada) script. The earliest literary work is the *Kavirājamārga* (c. AD 850), a treatise on poetics based on a Sanskrit model. Nearly all of the extant early texts in Kannada are poems on religious subjects written by Jaina authors. One of the most remarkable of these is the 12th-century Rāmāyaṇa of Abhinava Pampa.


The event has presented about the origin of language, various writers, poets and their contribution to the literature. The paired state BTKIT Dwarahat, Uttarakhand also participated in the event.
