 - Konkan**: The cuisine with a combination of Mahani, Gaudi, Saraswat, Brahmin, and Goan cuisines. The Konkan food has a lot of coconut in it and strong in masalas, red chillies, and coriander.
 - Varadi**: The cuisine for the interior Maharashtra or the Vidarbha area. The spicy Kolhapuri food emphasizes on mutton. The food of the Vidarbha region is prepared strong in red chilli powder and garlic.
