Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Rangoli Competition

The Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat programme is initiated by the Government of India to celebrate and strengthen the spirit of national integration. As the state of Assam is paired with the state of Rajasthan under this programme, Indian Institute of Information Technology Guwahati (IIITG), Bongora, Assam, undertook events to highlight and display the rich culture of Rajasthan through the events organized in the Institute. The following is a brief account of the event conducted during the month of November, 2019. Mandana Rangoli Competition:

Mandana is a famous art and painting form from Rajasthan. IIITG organized an institute level Rangoli competition on 3rd of November 2019 to promote the unique designs from the state. Students from the Institute participated in the event. Each participant was given two hours to complete one rangoli design based on the Mandana art form. They were also asked to speak a few works on the designs that they had presented. Three best designs judged on the basis of best tribal motifs, best colour combinations, overall design and participants' knowledge about the presented design, were awarded gift hampers.

There were a total of seven participants who enthusiatically participated and displayed their skills and knowledge on Rajasthani Mandana Art form. There were seven participants from the institute. 
