#### Know the states- Tripura and Mizoram

#### Tripura

- · One of the seven states of North East India
- It is bordered to the north, west, and south by Bangladesh, to the east by the state of Mizoram, and to the northeast by the state of Assam.
- The capital is Agartala near the Bangladesh border in the northwestern part of the state.
- predominantly a hilly region.
- Tripura was made a union territory on Sept. 1, 1956, and it became a state on Jan. 21, 1972.
- Tripura Population 2019 –4.6872 Million.
- Tripura is noted for bamboo and cane handicrafts. Bamboo played important part in the jhum cultivation (shifting cultivation) of the tribes.
- Bengali is the most spoken language, due to the predominance of Bengali people in the state. Kokborok is a prominent language among the tribes. Several other languages belonging to Indo-European and Sino-Tibetan families are spoken by the different tribes.
- Music and dances are integral part of the Tripuri tribal communities. Songs are sung during religious occasions, weddings, and other festivals. Each tribal community has their own repertoire of songs and dances.

#### Mizoram

- · One of the seven states of North East India.
- It is in the northeastern part of the country and is bounded by Myanmar (Burma) to the east and south and Bangladesh to the west and by the states of Tripura to the northwest, Assam to the north, and Manipur to the northeast.
- The capital is Aizawl, in the north-central part of the state
- Mizoram was previously part of Assam until 1972, when it was carved out as a Union Territory. It became the 23rd state of India, a step above Union Territory, on 20 February 1987.
- Mizoram is a highly literate agrarian economy, but suffers from slash-andburn jhum, or shifting cultivation, and poor crop yields
- · Mizo, English and Hindi are the official languages of the state.
- The majority (87%) of Mizos are Christians in various denominations, predominantly Presbyterian. Mizoram has a Chakma <u>Theravada</u> Buddhist population of 8.5%, making them the largest minority, followed by Hindus at 2.7% according to the 2011 census.
- · Festivals in Mizoram mostly centers around the harvest seasons.
