Kondapalli toys are famous in worldwide and also registred as one of the "Geographical indication handicarft" from 'Andhra Pradesh'. Kondapalli toys made in wood of Kondapalli of Krishna district, near Vijayawada in the Indian state of Andhra Pradesh.

colony in Kondapalli is the place where the art of crafting takes place.

"Bommala colony" translates to toys These toys are popularly assembled in the houses, during the festival of 'Sankranti' and 'Navratri' and is referred as 'Bommala Koluvu'.

Kondapalli toy making is a 400-year old art form that originated in **Krishna district's Kondapalli town**, Andhra Pradesh. The wood used for carving Kondapalli toys is from a locally abundant tree known as **"Tella Poniki."** The softness of the wood increases the ease of carving and precision in detail.




The "Krishna Leela" has persistently been the most memorable theme for Kondapalli toys.
