A Two-Day National seminar on Subaltern Literature: Quest for Identity, Equality and Fraternity, was held on September 12th and 13th 2019. She said, "Subaltern literature tries to focus our attention on the marginalized sections of the society which grapples with identity and even survival. Santhosh Kumar of Annamalai University delivered the valedictory address and distributed the certificates.
