Then we visited the Kurnool city where we first visited the Konda Reddy Fort after we free to see the city and the report back in front of the Konda Reddy Fort.

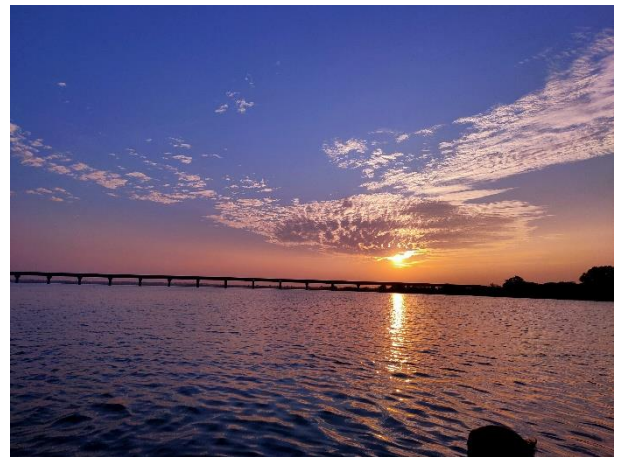
