REPORT ON STUDENTS CULTURAL EXCHANGE TOUR TO JAMSHEDPUR, JHARKHAND UNDER AKAM-EBSB

All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) under Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) and Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat (EBSB) organized student cultural exchange tour to Jamshedpur, Jharkhand. The purpose of this tour was to make students aware about India's diverse culture and heritage by pairing two states together. The state of Goa was paired with state of Jharkhand. Goa College of Engineering was selected as nodal institution for the state of Goa and Jamshedpur Womens University was nodal institution for state of Jharkhand for successful conduct of this program. Under this 25 students (13 boys and 12 girls) from Goa College of Engineering and 25 students from various schools in Goa were selected to visit the paired state Jharkhand. The students were accompanied by Asst. Prof. Madhuraj Naik and Mrs. Shivani Gadkari from Goa College of Engineering. The school students were accompanied Mrs. Archana Hudekar and Mr. Vallabh Barve.

The tour commenced on 3rd December 2022 from Madgaon railway station with a flagging off ceremony in the distinguished presence of Hon. Speaker of Goa Legislative Assembly, Shri. Ramesh Tawadkar. Also present for the flagging off ceremony were Dr. R.B. Lohani, Principal, Goa College of Engineering, Nodal Officers for AKAM-EBSB from Goa College of Engineering Dr. Sonali Pandit and Prof. Sonia Kuwelkar along with Heads of various Departments of Goa College of Engineering and Railway Officials.

The group arrived at Tatanagar station, Jamshedpur at approximately 11.00 am on 5th December 2022. The group was welcomed by Dr. Sweta Prasad, Dr. Kistwar Ara and Prof. Keya Bannerjee from Jamshedpur Women's University. CISF and RAF units were arranged for our security.

On arrival to Jamshedpur Women's University, girl students were placed in Girls hostel along with lady staff accompanying them. Boy students and male faculty were placed in Tribal Culture Centre inside Tata colony. An inaugural session was held by Jamshedpur Womens University at 4:00 pm which involved welcoming our group and few folk dances of Jharkhand.

On day 2 i.e. 6th December the group was taken to National Metallurgical Laboratory, Jamshedpur where students were introduced to various technologies and equipment like Scanning Electron Microscope (SEM), X-Ray Diffractometer (XRD), e-waste disposal, library and workshop. Lunch was provided to us in canteen. After lunch students were taken Tata Zoological Park to see various species of animals native to Jharkhand. Last visit of the day was to JRD Tata sports complex where students interacted with eminent sports personalities and were shown various facilities which are made available to sportspersons.

On day 3 i.e. 7th December the group was taken to Dalma wildlife sanctuary to see various native species of Jharkhand. Lunch was served in premises.
