

The webinar theme was designed to stimulate Life science professionals to enhance their research and their carrier in clinical research . The Dean Science Dr.J.Jayanthi highlighted the importance of Pharmacovigilance in the current scenario, she also declared that there will more such events with the aim to help the young health care professionals attain unique skills , gain further insight into the ways of clinical research Ms. Alamelu Murali, CEO Atria Biosciences was the resource person who delivered the presentation about potential avenues for all the life science student . According to her opinion the industry needs to take aggressive steps to demonstrate a safety focus— self-regulation in clinical research. She also discussed about epidemiology and classification of ADRs with reference to indigenous drugs and described about

basic methods to detect, evaluate and document ADRS. Finally she highlighted the needs of Pharmacovigilance and challenges in monitoring the safety in all volunteers. She also stressed the importance of clinical research ethics as an important principle in conducting any research.
