Hoysaleswara Temple, Halebidu



- It is a Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva
- The temple was built on the banks of a large man-made lake
- The Hoysaleswara temple is a twin-temple dedicated to Hoysaleswara and Santaleswara Shiva lingas
- It is the largest temple built by the Hoysalas that is dedicated to the Hindu god Shiva in South India
- The temple had towers on top of each sanctum, but they are now missing
- The temple was built with chloritic schist, more commonly known as greenschist or soapstone. The soapstone is soft when quarried and easier to carve into intricate shapes, but hardens over time when exposed to air
