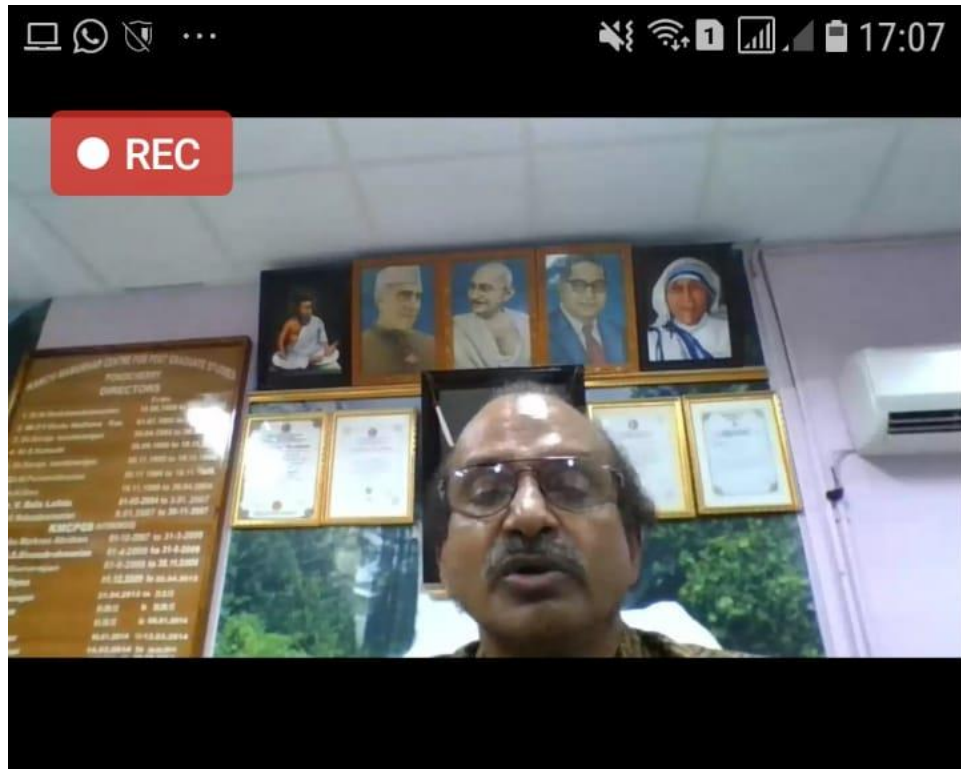
Resource person **Shri K. Amarnath Ramakrishna**, Superintending Archaeologist, ASI, Goa circle gave brief introduction and history about Archaeology in India. He said that archaeological findings are the primary source for historical writing. The historical past is deciphered through material remains left by our ancestors based on which reconstruction is done. He said that in western part of Indian subcontinent including Gujarat and Maharashtra more than 10,000 excavations have been done. In Tamil Nadu during 1963 hand axe tools were discovered in Pallavaram that is considered to be an important discovery in southern India. He gave a brief account of other excavation sites including Adichanallur, Arikamedu, Patliputhra, Nalanda, Shravasti, Rakhigarhi, Kalibangan, etc. and finally he gave a the insights into Keezhadi excavations.

At the end of the session the queries and doubts were answered in an effective manner by the resource person. The staff and student members gave good feedback and they were overwhelmed by this Webinar.

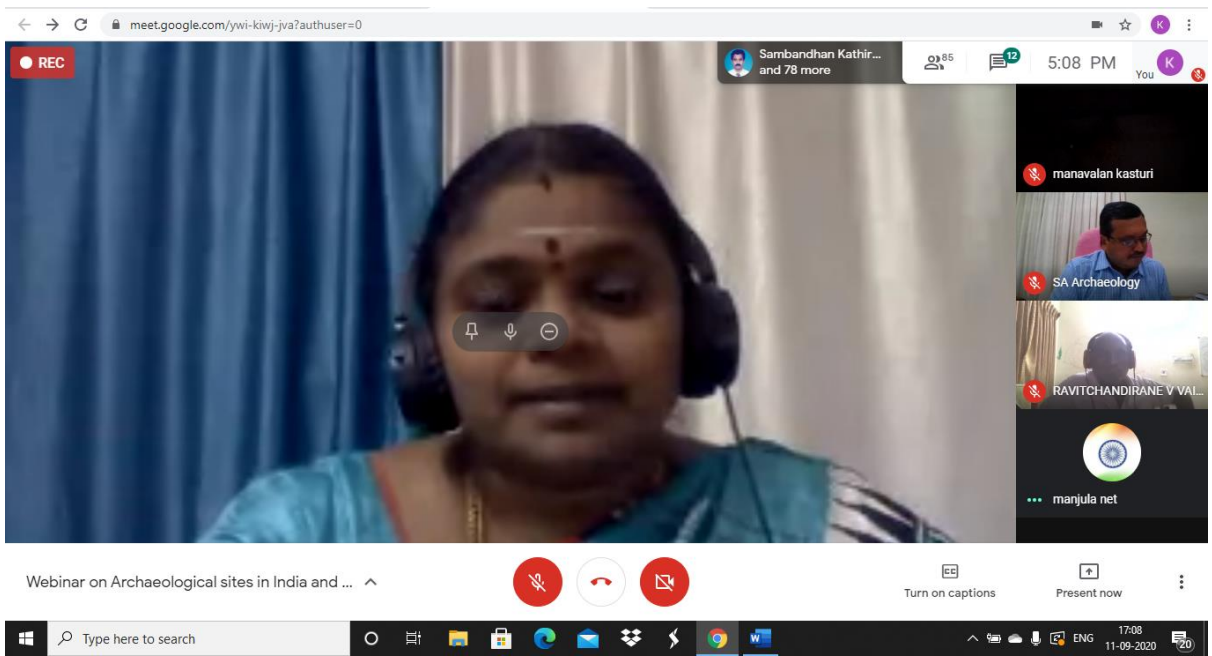
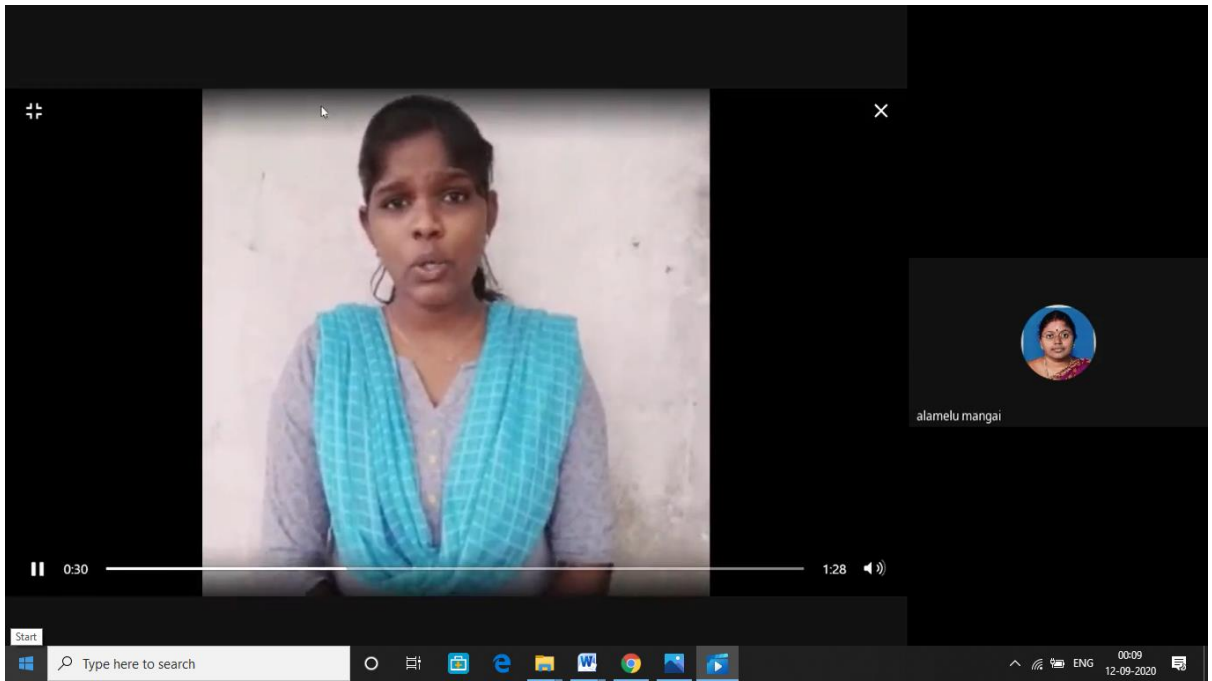


