Rajasthani was mentioned for the first time as ‘marubhasha ‘among the list of 18 local languages mentioned in the “kuvlaymala” written by Udyotan Suri in 913 AD.

Most of the Rajasthani languages are chiefly spoken in the state of Rajasthan but are also spoken in Gujarat, Haryana and Punjab. Rajasthani languages are also spoken in the Bah provinces of Punjab and Tharparkar district of Sindh. It merges with Riasti and Saraiki in Bahawalpur and Multan areas, respectively. This language is common in many areas of Lahore, Punjab, Pakistan





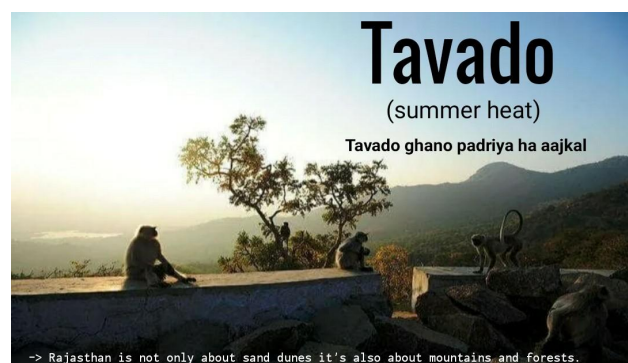
