- Pa Togan Nengminza Sangma was one of the Garo Warrior. He fought and died for his own motherland and community. Till date, the Government of Meghalaya is celebrating 12th December every year as Pa Togan Nengminza's Day. Kiang Nangbah was one of the Jaintia Freedom Fighter in India's Struggle for Independence who sacrificed his life for the sake of his land and people. He was hanged to death by the British on the 30th December, 1862, whose martyrdom is commemorated every year on the 30th December every year. However, we can see that in the National Level they did not get their due recognition as compared to other Freedom Fighters.
