
Nati: A Folk Dance in Himachal Pradesh

In Himachal Pradesh, the Nati folk dance of Kullu district has made a world record by entering the Guinness Book of World Records as the largest folk dance in the world on January 11, 2016.

Nati dance is a local folk dance of Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh and depicts ras lila or dances concerning Hindu God Krishna and Gopis and the entertaining plays of Chandravali. Dancers join their hands and make movement accordingly with the music and rhythm. However, there are thirteen styles. This dance was traditionally performed by men who wear decorated caps, sashes, churidaars and swirling tunics but now it has been performed by women mostly.
