### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

With almost 90 million speakers worldwide, Marathi is the 15<sup>th</sup> most commonly spoken language in the world. The **Marathi Bhasha Din** is a day marked to celebrate the heritage of Marathi - also marked in honor of Kusumagraj or VV Shirwadkar, a noted Marathi playwright. It is celebrated every year on February 27 to honor the birth anniversary of Shri. Vishnu Vaman Shirwadkar, who was popularly known as 'Kusumagraj'.

Shri. Shirwadkar was an eminent Marathi poet, playwright, novelist, short story writer, and humanist. He wrote a lot about freedom, justice, and social evils like poverty. He wrote 16 volumes of poems, three novels, eight volumes of short stories, seven volumes of essays, and 18 plays and six one-act play.

Sadhu Vaswani Institute of Management Studies for Girls (SVIMS) and Dr. Ambedkar Memorial Institute of Information Technology & Management Sciences (DAMITS), celebrated the day through various cultural performances, to celebrate the rich and vibrant literature available on Marathi language.
