#### Report of the Program (10<sup>th</sup> -19<sup>th</sup> October, 2022)





Our journey started on 10<sup>th</sup> of October with flagging off ceremony from the prestigious campus of Gurukul Kangri (Deemed to be University), Haridwar at 1:00 PM. We took bus to reach Kashmiri gate bus stand in Delhi.

By 9:30 we boarded Duronto express and settled down for night. 11<sup>th</sup> of October passed with lot of thrill and excitement on board the train.





## **Day 1: 12<sup>th</sup> October 2022**

On 12th of October, we reached Yeswanthpur Jn. Station of Bengaluru and were received by the faculty members and volunteers of BMS College of Engineering and were greeted by flowers and warmth.

After the breakfast, an introduction cum cultural programme was organized at the BMSCE auditorium. An inspirational talk was delivered by Dr PRS Chetan (Commanding Officer).

He provided us with a few important lessons like Believe in your strengths; Time management is life management; Bounce back with passion; when it comes to success, there are no shortcuts etc. which was followed by a beautiful folk dance of the state of Karnataka Dollu Kunitha.









Then the ceremony ended with a briefing for the schedules for the second, third, fourth and fifth day followed by dinner.

Day 2: 13th October 2022 After the breakfast, we visited Ramnagarm





Sholay hills are located 50 km away from Bangalore km in Ramnagaram, the Sholay Shooting HillTop was once a sleepy village and after two and a half years of shooting it certainly gained a lot of importance. The hill was the hideout place for Gabbar and the rugged terrains made the region look like a perfect place for the robbers.







**Shri Pattabhirama temple:** Shri Pattabhirama temple is an ancient temple which as per local legend was established by the monkey king Sugreeva. The idol of Lord Rama, Sita ji and Lakshamana along with Hanuman is said to be of Ramayana era.

The current temple structure is said to be more than 1000 years old





Just behind the temple there is a beautiful pond called as Sita Mata pond or Sitadevi Pond.



After visiting the main temple, a trek of further 15 minutes was accomplished to reach at the top of the Ramadevara Betta Hills supported and facilitated by CISF staff.



After returning back we had our lunch. The next place on the itinerary was Janapada Loka It is a museum based on folk art of Karnataka. It is a Beautiful 15-acre campus, where Karnataka's rural milieus have been recreated to keep the pulse of the past alive. It is situated in Ramanagaram. Ramanagara district in the Indian state of Karnataka, on the Bangalore-Mysore highway, 53 KM to the south of Bangalore. Bangalore University has recognized it as a research center in the field of folk art.





Henceforth, Janapada Loka conducts classes and issues Janapada Diploma and Janapada Certificate courses. It also conducts Folk related development camp, folk research workshop, and seminars. A well-equipped library gives huge choice to read from. Annual Festivals like Lokothsava in February – March, Kite Festival in July, Dassera Festival in October are organized which attracts people from all over the world. Janapada Loka has been founded by Nage Gowda, a prominent Kannada folklorist and author. In 1986 he started work on this project and it was opened to the public in 1994. Janapada Loka is divided into separate wings — Folk art museum, Loka Mahal, Chitra Kuteera, Doddamane, Shilamala, Arghyamala etc. The museum has a collection of 5,000 folk artifacts.

The next place on the itinerary was the complex of Sports Authority India (Neetaji Subhash Southern Centre, Bengaluru).

Here the students got an insights of different sports game, and how players practice and prepare themselves for the Olympics, National & International level Events. We had the privilege to meet some eminent Indian Coaches of different sports.





Day 3: 14th October 2022, The day started with breakfast followed by a visit to Visvesvaraya Industrial Technological Museum. The Visvesvarava **Industrial** and **Technological** Museum (VITM), Bangalore, India, a constituent unit of the National Council of Science Museums (NCSM), Ministry of Culture, Government of India. The 4,000 m<sup>2</sup> (43,000 sq ft) building was constructed in Cubbon Park, and was inaugurated by the first Prime Minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, on 14 July 1962. The museum displays industrial products, scientific models and engines. This splendid museum dedicated to the memory of Bharat Ratna M. Visvesvaraya, the architect of modern Karnataka, houses various technical inventions and offers you a glimpse of the history of technological development in the country. A major attraction here is a 1:1 scale replica of the Wright Brothers' Flyer, the World's first piloted aircraft and a 'Flyer Simulator' that offers a delightful experience to visitors. At the Dinosaur Corner, one can also witness the movement and sound of a life-sized animated Spinosaurus in a recreated environment. It is located in Bangalore at 5km. distance from BMS College.









The next on the itinerary was magnificent Vidhan Shaudha of Karnataka. After visiting Vidhan Shaudha we visited ISKCON Sri Radha Krishna temple which is recognized as one of the famous places to visit in Bangalore and best maintained ISKCON temple in the world.







**Day 4: 15th October 2022** 

Day 4 was marked by the Visit to Mysuru. We went from Bangalore to Mysore on 4th day of our trip. We had breakfast at our stay (BMS College of engineering, Bangalore) and started for Mysuru by Bus. It took around 5 hours to reach and we had lunch after reaching Mysuru.






After that we visited Mysuru palace. Mysuru is an important landmark in Indian freedom struggle. It witnessed freedom stuggle with British and known for introduction of rockets in warfare.

In the evening we also went to Brindavan garden. The Brindavan Gardens is located at the Mandya District, some 24 Km far from Mysore district. The dam below which the Garden was built separates the garden into two parts. The whole garden lies on both of the banks as if a glittering necklace is worn by the river which makes it more uniquely amazing. The garden is popularly called as the Illuminated Terrace Garden.



#### **Day 5: 16th October 2022**

Day 5 was the last day of the trip. We headed towards the indoor stadium of the BMS College of Engineering. Then we left for Jawaharlal Nehru Planetarium. There we watched a show in the sky theatre about the solar system, prominent constellations and various mythological stories associated to them. The show was projected using 3D animations and was extremely fascinating.

After the show, we went to the science park which was just opposite to the planetarium. It had some amazing science exhibits. The things we used to study in our books were there happening practically.





We left at 3 pm, reached back to the College and had our lunch. Then we headed towards the college auditorium for the valedictory ceremony. In the evening we have visited Big Bull Temple and Dodda Ganesha temple after that we have visited local market to purchase local goods.
