28th Feb – 6th Mar, 2023

The delegates were received at the New Delhi Railway Station on 28th Feb,2023 by Faculty members and National Service Scheme, JNU volunteers.



In JNU, respected Rector-I, Rector-II, Nodal officer of Yuva Sangam, Dean of Student, faculty members as well as the students welcomed them with tradition of tilak, garland, stole,

symbolising a token of love and oneness. Post dinner, the delegates had a talk with faculty and students of JNU and later everyone joined for a dance on the tunes of the drumbeats.
